As you are deciding which trips you would like to apply for, remember that you can participate in these trips only once so you should not sign up for a trip you've gone on in the past years. The exception is Animal Science in which you can attend in a different subject area.

The 4-H Council will be selecting the trip participants in mid-March (***if your application is late, you will not be considered for a trip opportunity!***). I will then notify the 4-H members that have been selected to attend each trip by mid-April. AEROSPACE WORKSHOP

Date: June 10-12

Location: Purdue University Campus

Who: 4-H'ers enrolled in 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade on Jan. 1, 2009.

Purpose: Build model rockets and planes, take a ride in a small airplane, and talk to an astronaut by phone as you learn about the principles of flight and career opportunities.

Number Selected: Fifty participants from the state.

Cost: Delegate pays \$60 and sponsor pays \$75

AMBASSADOR WORKSHOP

Date: June 10-12

Location: Purdue University Campus

Who: 4-H'ers enrolled in 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade on Jan. 1, 2009.

Purpose: To train 4-H'ers to be 4-H spokespersons in Johnson County by enhancing verbal and written skills.

Number Selected: 2 delegates from the county.

Cost: Delegate pays \$60 and sponsor pays \$75

ANIMAL SCIENCE WORKSHOP

Date: June 10-12

Location: Purdue University Campus

Who: 4-H'ers with a special interest in one of the following livestock species: Aquaculture, Beef, Companion Animals, Dairy, Dairy Goat, Horse and Pony, Sheep, Poultry, Rabbit, Swine, and Vet Science. Member should be enrolled in the project for 2009.

Grade Requirements: 4-H'ers enrolled in 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade on Jan. 1, 2009.

Purpose: 1. Gain information on livestock, poultry production management and aquaculture.

2. Learn about career opportunities in animal agriculture.

3. Leadership development.

Number Selected: Two (2) delegates per animal species.

Cost: Delegate pays \$60 and sponsor pays \$75

COMPUTER SCIENCE WORKSHOP

Date: June 10-12

Location: Purdue University Campus

Who: 4-H'ers enrolled in 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade on Jan. 1, 2009.

Purpose: Introduce 4-H'ers to new and emerging trends in the computer science industry.

Number Selected: Twenty applicants in each of the 2 tracks from the state.

Number Selected: 1-2 delegates. Fifty from the state.

Cost: Delegate pays \$50 and sponsor pays \$50

ENGINEERING SCIENCE WORKSHOP

Date: June 10-12

Location: Purdue University Campus

Who: 4-H'ers enrolled in 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade on Jan. 1, 2009.

Purpose: Ever wonder what engineers do? The three-day Engineering Science Workshop will shed some light on this question. You will learn how robots operate, what makes a good fuel for internal combustion engines, how computers draw without pencils, how to select the best vegetable/fruit variety for mechanical harvesting, and how to surf the Internet. The program will also introduce you to careers in various engineering fields

Purpose: Learn about insect structure and function, insect forensics, aquatic insects, vector biology, social insects, the molecular biology of insects, and how to control insects.

Number Selected: Twenty-five delegates from the state.

Date: June 10-12

Location: Purdue University Campus

Grade Requirements: 4-H'ers enrolled in 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade on Jan. 1, 2009.

Purpose: Are you interested in foods, science and being part of an exciting and rapidly expanding industry? But not quite sure where you fit in? Then the Food Science and Human Nutrition Workshop is where you should be. Explore career possibilities in Food Science; Nutrition Science; Nutrition, Fitness and Health; Foods and Nutrition in Business; and Dietetics.

Number Selected: Seventy-two delegates from the state.

MISSION TO MARS WORKSHOP

Purpose: Introduce students to the complex issues of traveling to and living on Mars. Hands-on activities are based on current research being done at NASA. Students will learn about plant growth, ecosystems, recycling, food production, and Mars habitats.

3. Development of wholesome attitudes.
4. Awareness of self and others.

Number Selected: 2-4 delegates

Cost: Delegate pays \$65 and sponsor pays \$85

Date: August 4-9

Location: Indiana State Fairgrounds

Who: Any 4-H'er not participating in other State Fair activity.

Grade Requirements: Any Indiana youth Grade 10, 11, and 12

Purpose:

1. Promote personal growth and leadership development.
2. Provide new insight into government, culture and human relations.
3. Become more aware of the workings of the community.

Number Selected: Four delegates.

Cost: Delegate pays \$60 and sponsor pays \$75

PURDUE ROUND-UP

Date: June 22-24

Location: Purdue University Campus

Who: Any 4-H'er who has not previously attended Round-Up.

Grade Requirements: Enrolled in grades 7-9 on Jan. 1, 2009.

Purpose:

1. Participation in educational and inspiring programs and tours.
2. Career exploration.
3. Become acquainted with Purdue University.
4. Make new friends.

Number Selected: Fifteen (15) delegates.

Cost: Delegate pays \$60 and expense for meals. Sponsor pays \$75

STATE 4-H BAND

Date: June 20-22

Location: Purdue University Campus

Who: Youth should be entering or in high school, however consideration will be given to youth entering 8th grade.

What: Youth attend a 3-day band workshop at Purdue which culminates with a performance at 4-H Round-Up. Participants are chosen through a written application, which includes a recommendation from their band and/or instrument instructor. Selection is made by the 4-H State Band Director and the State Band Coordinator.

Cost: Delegate pays \$150 plus transportation and meals.

STATE 4-H CHORUS

Date: June 20-24

Location: Purdue University Campus

Who: Youth should be entering or in high school, however consideration will be given to youth entering 8th grade.

What: Youth attend a 5-day choral workshop at Purdue which culminates with a performance at 4-H Round-Up. State 4-H Chorus also performs at the Indiana State Fair. Participants are chosen through a written application, which includes a recommendation from their vocal and/or choral instructor. Selection is made by the 4-H State Chorus Director and the State Chorus Coordinator.

Cost: Delegate pays \$225 plus transportation and meals.
