Standard Chickens

Hens & Cocks – Birds one year or more on day of show. **Pullets & Cockerels** – Birds less than one year old on day of show. **Pen of Hens or Pen of Pullets** is a production class and only birds known for egg production should be used. Also, your birds should look and weigh the same. **Broilers** – 2 birds same sex, 6-8 weeks old, same weight and not over 5-1/2 lbs. on day of show. **Roasters** – 2 birds same sex, 8-1/2 weeks old, same weight and between 5-1/2 – 10 lbs. on day of show.

Standard Ducks

Mature Hens & Drakes – Birds one year or older as of first day of state fair. **Young Hens & Drakes** – Birds less than one year as of first day of state fair. **Meat Pen** – 2 birds same sex, same weight, 6-10 weeks old. You should bring ducks that are known for meat production.

Turkeys

Mature Hens & Toms – Birds one year or more as of day of show. **Young Hens & Toms** – Birds less than one year as of day of show. **Meat Pen** – 2 birds same sex, same weight, 16-24 weeks old.

Miscellaneous Birds & Wildfowl

A pair of birds such as pheasant, quail, pigeon, or guineas may be shown in this class. No peafowl or ratites (emus, ostriches, rheas) allowed. The “pair” needs to be one male and one female. 4-H members must bring their own cage, and “10% of the score will be based on the cage *and decorations*.” **NOTE:** Some of these birds require federal permits from the DNR. Permits must be shown at entry time, and permit numbers will be recorded on pen card.
