I hereby certify that:

1. My 4-H animal has been in my continuous ownership since the date printed on the respective 4-H Enrollment Form; (except for Poultry and Rabbits, which do not have such a form).
2. The exhibitor and the exhibitor's parents and/or legal guardians agree that they are the people absolutely responsible for the care and custody of their animals in preparation for and while at the Indiana State Fair; including, but not limited to, policies regarding drug use and animal well being.
3. I am responsible for: adhering to withdrawal times on all drugs administered to my animal, only giving my animal drugs that are approved by the FDA, and keeping my animal free of illegal drugs prior to and during the Indiana State Fair.
4. My 4-H animal has not been maintained at a professional fitter's facilities:

My submission of a 4-H entry expressly binds me to all terms and conditions contained in any and all parts of the Indiana State Fair 4-H/FFA Handbook/Premium List, to include, but not limited to, consent to drug, steroid, tissue tests, examination of my animal's carcass and insertion of a micro chip for identification as a condition of entering the Indiana State Fair.

1. Affidavit - a written statement of fact which is sworn to as the truth before an authorized officer.
2. (code 15-2.1-21-9) - A person who knowingly or intentionally violates or fails to comply with this article commits a Class D Felony.⁽⁶⁾
3. Perjury - knowingly making a false material statement under oath or affirmation. In Indiana, a person who commits perjury commits a Class D felony⁽⁶⁾, which may be punishable by imprisonment, fine or restitution. (Indiana Code 35-44-2-1 and 35-50-2-7).
4. Prosecution for violations of Indiana law will be referred to the proper authorities.
5. Oath - An affirmation of truth of a statement before an authorized person.
6. Felony - A crime of graver or more serious nature than those designated as misdemeanors.

WHY A 4-H ANIMAL AFFIDAVIT?

As a 4-H livestock owner you are both a consumer and a producer in our food chain. Just like the milk that you drink and the vegetables that you eat, the meat that you produce must be safe and wholesome for human consumption.

As a 4-H livestock member, you may only raise and sell livestock once a year. Hence you may be unfamiliar and unaccustomed to the drug withdrawal times for some products that are fed or given to your livestock. Keeping accurate records of medications and supplements helps to keep you from contaminating our food chain. The 4-H animal affidavit supports the need to produce and sell a quality, wholesome product for the consumers that eat the meat you produce. The 4-H affidavit enables 4-H program supporters, who generously invest in 4-H members when they purchase animals through a 4-H livestock auction, to know that the animal(s) that they purchase will be safe for human consumption!

Any feed additive, antibiotic, insecticide, medicine, or other drug product that is fed, injected or used with your 4-H animal should be listed on your 4-H animal affidavit. Withdrawal times for drugs is necessary so an animal can naturally clear these substances from the meat it produces, before it is processed for the food chain. By listing this information on your affidavit, it can easily be reviewed so that all 4-H animals that are sold are ready for human consumption when they enter our food chain.

Remember. . . - I believe in the humane treatment and the responsible 4-H care of all livestock and pets.

- It is my responsibility as a 4-H member and owner to care for my animals regardless of the weather, how I feel or other things that I might like to do.
