Mini 4-Hers will receive manuals for explaining the projects and a monthly 4-H newsletter. Members will participate in meetings held in the months of March, April, May and June. These meetings will help you learn more hands-on skills about your project, meet with your friends, and eat treats.

First year members are only allowed to enter in one project, second year members have the option of enrolling in two different projects, but not the same as the first year. Project areas include: collections, crafts/art, foods, sewing and animal related posters.

Do you like making collages, mosaics, splatter painting, or potato printing ... let your imagination create your project!



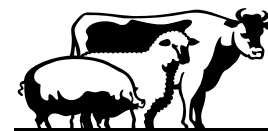
FOODS
