TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. 4-H Fashion Revue Judging will take place on Thursday, July 9th at 5:30 PM in the 4-H Meeting Room at the Fairgrounds. The Vigo County 4-H Fashion Revue will be **Monday, July 13th at 7:00 PM** in the 4-H Show Arena. Participants must take part in the Vigo County 4-H Fashion Revue in order to receive awards and be eligible to compete in the state competition.
2. Wearable sewing exhibits must have been made since the past year's county exhibit.
3. Handcrafted garments made in the 4-H Crafts project may be modeled in the Fashion Revue whenever the finished garment(s) meets the requirements of a Fashion Revue classification.
4. A participant does not have to exhibit the same outfit that is worn in Fashion Revue. However, to participate in the Fashion Revue, a garment must be exhibited at the Fair. **The grade level of the entry in fashion revue must match the grade level entered in the sewing project.**
5. All participants will be judged on their "total look."
6. An entrant may enter more than one Senior Division Classification.
7. An outfit is a garment or garments that when put together make a complete look – such as one or two piece dress, or one or two piece pant suit, or a three piece combination, such as pants, vest, and blouse, or shirt.
8. A champion and a reserve is chosen at each grade level of sewing in grades 3 – 7 and one Junior Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion is awarded.
9. A champion and reserve is chosen in each State Fair category and one senior grand champion and reserve is awarded.
10. For the Just Sew divisions, one Junior Champion and Reserve and one Senior Champion and Reserve will be chosen with an overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion awarded.

CLASSIFICATIONS – SEWING JUNIOR DIVISION

LEVEL A

Grade 3 - **Wearable** – Elastic waist shorts, pants OR skirt

Grade 4 - **Wearable** – Shorts, pants, skirt, shirt, top or BBQ apron

LEVEL B

Grade 5 - **Wearable** – Simple shirt with sleeves, sun dress, jumper or simple 2 piece pajamas

Grade 6 - **Wearable** – Two garments that can be worn together

LEVEL C

Grade 7 - **Wearable** – School or sports outfit

Grades 8 – 9 - **Wearable** – Choose a fashion revue category

LEVEL D

Grades 10 – 12 - **Wearable** – Choose a fashion revue category

SEWING STATE FAIR ELIGIBILITY

1. Participant must be a 4-H member in grades 8 – 12 on January 1, 2009.
2. An entrant can enter in only one (1) State Fair 4-H Fashion Revue Classification.
3. Costumes to be worn in the State Fair 4-H Fashion Revue cannot be exhibited in the State Fair 4-H Sewing Exhibit.

Each county can send six participants to the State 4-H Fashion Revue (maximum two per category). On the county level, if there are no entries in a category, counties may send a second participant to the State Fashion Revue from another category.

NOTE: Grades 3 – 7 can participate in the local Fashion Revue only. Exhibitors in grades 8 – 12 must enter in one of the fashion revue categories.

FASHION REVUE CATEGORIES

INFORMAL OR CASUAL WEAR – A complete outfit of 1 or 2 pieces suitable for school, weekend, or casual, informal activities.

DRESS UP – This is suitable for special, church, or social occasions that are not considered to be formal. It may be an outfit of one or more pieces with or without its own costume coat or jacket (lined or unlined). This is not an outfit that would be worn to school, weekend, or casual, informal activities.

FREE CHOICE – A complete outfit comprised of garments that do not fit in the other classifications. Examples include: tennis wear, swim wear, athletic or sportswear, lounge wear, riding habits, historic, dance, theatrical, or international costumes, capes, and unlined coats.

SUIT OR COAT – The suit consists of two pieces including a skirt or pants and its own lined jacket. It is not a dress with jacket as in “Dress-Up Wear.” The coat is a separate lined coat. It will be judged separately as a coat with its own accessories.

SEPARATES – Consists of three garments that must be worn as a coordinated complete outfit. Each piece should be versatile enough to be worn with other garments.

FORMAL WEAR – This outfit may be one or more pieces suitable for any formal occasion, such as proms, weddings, and formal evening functions.

Handcrafted garments should be modeled in the appropriate classification.

A wrap (cape, coat, shawl, etc.) which would be worn during the entire formal occasion may be modeled in the formal classification. If the wrap is designed to be worn only to and from the occasion, the total outfit can be modeled in the Free Choice classification. If the formal or wrap is to be judged on its own merit, it should be placed in the appropriate classification.

If a wedding outfit is considered a formal by the participant, it may be worn in Formal Wear. However, if the participant considers the outfit to be a costume, it may be worn in the Free Choice classification.

- Every person participating in the 4-H Fashion Revue will receive one \$2 premium, no matter how many entries they exhibit.
