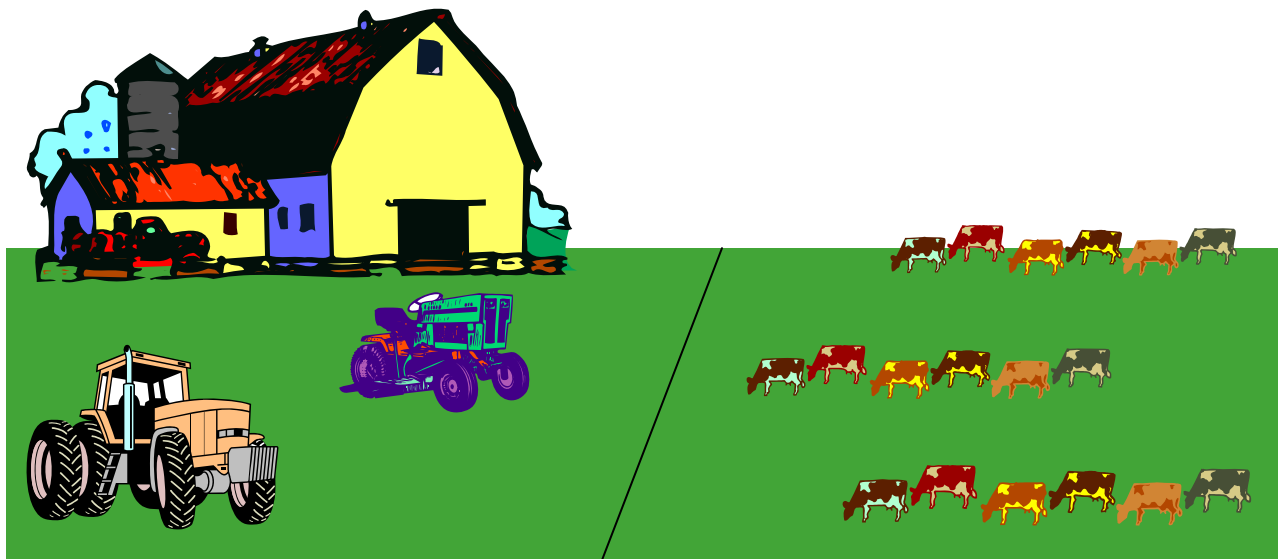

Farm Model Display



FARM MODEL DISPLAY

The purpose of this project and exhibit is to motivate and interest young people in modeling and custom built farm model display. Create a realistic display around manufactured or custom built farm toys. There are many different artistic abilities one can use in building a farm toy display. Modeling is very personal and involves much imagination.

GENERAL RULES

1. Projects will be judged by Beginner, Intermediate, or Advanced.
2. Show and explain your display.
3. Complete this record book.
4. Due to space and display limitations we need to limit the size of backdrops. If you choose to use a backdrop it can only be 10 ½ inches tall or less.

FAIR EXHIBIT

Beginner 3rd - 5th Grade-Will exhibit a Farm Display 24" x 36" Display must be built on rigid wood (plywood). This division will be limited to field tilling (toy plows, disc, or planting). Roads, lanes, trees, fence rows, and back drop may be used to set off field or fields. No buildings, animals or harvesting (hay making is considered a Harvesting activity) may be used in this division.

Intermediate 6th - 8th Grade - Will exhibit a Farm Display 24" x 48". Display must be built on rigid wood (plywood). This division will be limited to any type of field trees, fence rows, back drop, and animals May be used. No buildings may be used in this division.

Advanced 9th - 12th grade - Will exhibit a Farm Display 48" x 48". Display must be built on rigid wood (plywood). This division is open to create any type of farm. Example: Farmstead, (buildings, grain handling equipment, field work, harvesting, or farm equipment stores).

Farm Displays can be modeled in 1/64 or 1/16 or any other scale desired.

Farm Displays can be obtained at farm equipment dealers, farm stores, and farm toy shows. Farm toy shows will probably offer the largest selection of toys.
