What Is Safe Food for the Hungry 2005 – Designing for Choice?

What is the program format?

This is a free videoconference, to be offered at specified sites, (see box opposite) that will last 1½ hours.

What topics will be covered?

- The videoconference is an opportunity for staff and volunteers of food pantries, like yours, to learn the “why” of “client choice” and how it can be implemented in your facility.
- You’ll learn how to reorganize your space, no matter how small, to give your clients the ability to select food for themselves and for their families.
- We will explore different methods of “client choice,” and you will find one to suit your style of pantry.
- Need to ask questions about “client choice”? Our studio panel will be there to answer them via our “800” number and e-mail.

You’ll get all this and more in a 1½-hour videoconference.

Intended Audience

- Directors, staff, and volunteers from food banks and food pantries.
- Cooperative Extension specialists, EFNEP and FNP coordinators and assistants, and county educators who work with feeding programs.
- County, state, and local health officials who work with emergency feeding programs.

How do I register?

You may register via e-mail or by calling toll-free to 1-888-EXT-INFO (398-4636). The deadline to register is Feb. 15. To register via e-mail, go to the Safe Food for the Hungry Web site, <http://www.cfs.purdue.edu/safefood> click on the “Videoconference 2005” button and fill in all your information in the e-mail registration form. If you elect to register by phone, call toll-free to 1-888-EXT-INFO (398-4636). An operator will ask for your name, address, organization, daytime phone number and the site where you plan to view the videoconference. Multiple participants from your organization are encouraged to attend, but you should register each person separately.

What does it cost?

It’s FREE! Funding for the satellite videoconference is provided by:

- State of Indiana Family and Social Services Administration, Division of Family and Children, Housing and Community Services Section, through a grant from the Department of Health and Human Services for the Community Food and Nutrition Program
- The Department of Foods and Nutrition, Purdue University

Although there is no charge for this videoconference, space is limited, so register early to reserve your space.
